

About Lawrenceburg

An historic city known for its collection of federal-style architecture, the City of Lawrenceburg is also home to two of the region's largest attractions,

Argosy Casino & Hotel and Perfect North Slopes. Often referred to as "Whiskey City," Lawrenceburg has a strong connection to the distillery industry and



is the site of a Pernod-Ricard (Seagram Americas) distillery.

Lawrenceburg's portion of Dearborn Trails begins at the city's western limits and runs 1.7 miles.

About Greendale

Located adjacent to the intersection of I-275 and U.S. 50, the City of Greendale is the gateway to Southeast Indiana and the starting point of Indiana's portion of the nationally-designated Ohio River Scenic Byway. Home to a thriving business corridor as well as a leafy residential section, Greendale is known for its exceptional quality-of-life and has been named a Tree City U.S.A.

Greendale's portion of Dearborn Trails runs for approximately one mile and is situated atop the levy parallel to U.S. 50.

It ends at the entrance to Argosy Casino & Hotel.

DEARBORN COUNTY - SOUTHEAST INDIANA



Welcome to Dearborn County, Southeast Indiana

Dearborn County, Indiana is situated along the Ohio River where Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky meet. Located adjacent to Interstates 275 and 74, Dearborn County is just 15 miles from the Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport and 22 miles from downtown Cincinnati.



With a variety of great attractions and scenic, natural setting, Dearborn County is a popular destination for visitors to Southeast Indiana, and the county's Dearborn Trails project promises to be a top draw. The project

includes a multi-use hike, bike, walk, and skate trail in the communities of Greendale, Lawrenceburg and Aurora. Later in 2006, the Aurora and Lawrenceburg trails will be linked together.

About Aurora

With its historic architecture and scenic setting along the Ohio River, Aurora is a popular destination for visitors who come to enjoy the city's shops, restaurants and riverfront park. The city is also home to Hillforest Victorian House Museum, an 1855 Italianate mansion offering picturesque views of the river and surrounding downtown district.

Aurora's portion of Dearborn Trails begins at Manchester Landing and runs east approximately two miles to the Tanner's Creek bridge.



Rules & Regulations

- Trail is open from dawn to dusk
- Obey all trail signs
- No motorized vehicles on trail
- Yield to slower trail users
- Keep right – pass on left
- Give audible warning before passing
- If you stop, step off of the trail
- Yield to vehicular traffic at intersections
- Keep the trail clean “pack it in, pack it out”
- Remove all animal waste
- All pets must be on a 6’ leash
- No alcohol allowed
- All park, City, State and Federal Laws are strictly enforced.
- Call 911 to report emergencies
